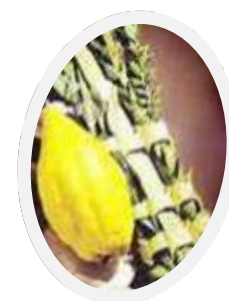

With no statewide elections in New Jersey in 2016, national issues are taking center stage this election cycle. However, with Governor Christie’s potential role in a Trump administration, at least one “safe” congressional seat in play, and the state’s economic, transportation, education, and environmental sectors heavily influenced – even jeopardized - by what goes on nationally, New Jersey has a huge stake in the outcome November 8.

Professor David Myers

Jewish History and Jewish Memory: Colleagues or Competitors

Monday, September 26, 7:30 PM



We Jews are interested in – some might say obsessed with – our history. But what we call our history is often our collective memory and THE two are frequently in conflict. Archeologists cannot be sure the Exodus actually happened; yet each Pesach we praise God for freeing us from Egypt. *Fiddler on the Roof* makes us nostalgic for the shtetl, even as historians make it clear Anatevka was a place of poverty and strife. The success of Jewish life depends on the balance of the historical rootedness of our past and the sometimes less than historical memories and traditions that flow from it. No one is better equipped to explore this balance with us than Professor David Myers, the Sady and Ludwig Kahn Professor of History at UCLA and a frequent visitor to Temple B’nai Abraham.

Myers, who was chair of UCLA’s history department and directed its Center for Jewish Studies, has written and lectured widely – literally, all over the world – on modern Jewish history and Jewish intellectual history. Myers’ last presentation at Temple B’nai Abraham dealt with the fascinating Hasidic community of Kiryas Joel, the subject of a forthcoming book. The present topic comes from another forthcoming book, *The Stakes of History* that explores the relationship between history and memory.

Last year we read books by some of the newest voices on the Israeli literary scene. This year we return to three of Israel's grandmasters, A.B. Yehoshua, Amos Oz and Aharon Appelfeld. The Yehoshua and Oz books are new: Appelfeld's was published in Israel in 1995 but has just been translated into English. Critical and popular successes, all books remind us why their authors are celebrated in Israel and around the world.

Noga, an Israeli harpist with a Dutch orchestra, returns home for three months to house sit her mother's rent-controlled Jerusalem apartment while her mother experiments with assisted living. Moving among short-term jobs, she reacquaints herself with Israel, a *yoredet* back home, a part-timer in a full-time world. An ex-husband carrying a torch does not make things easier.

Thursday, November 3 *Between Friends* by Amos Oz

The fictional Kibbutz Yekhat is the setting for these eight interrelated stories, through which Oz evokes the feeling and the mood of kibbutz life during Israel's first two decades. Through gripping stories, Oz's many years spent on a kibbutz are evident as he presents the lofty ideals and petty behavior with which these kibbutzniks plow their personal and collective fields.

Holocaust Thought with Jill Tejada

Life-long Temple member and Holocaust scholar Jill Tejada is a history teacher at Livingston High School whose innovative classes on Holocaust and Genocide have received national and international attention. A graduate of Boston University and the recipient of a Master's degree from NYU, she is completing her doctorate in Holocaust Studies at Drew University. ***The Machinery of Mass Murder*** : How did the Holocaust actually happen? While very idea of the Final Solution seems inconceivable, so is the idea of the bureaucracy of death of millions of people, which involved designing and building scores of special camps, identifying and rounding up victims, keeping many of them alive and working and arranging an "alternative" for the others, dealing with the transportation, overseeing the whole enterprise...we will examine the Final Solution from the beginning to understand just how the unthinkable could actually happen.

History through Text with Rabbi Kulwin

History Through Text is a seminar to be offered throughout the year, taught by Rabbi Kulwin. Taught in blocks, each class will also be a stand-alone unit, so that an inability to attend all (or even most) of the sessions will not be an impediment to an enjoyable and simulating learning experience.

Jewish Life In The Middle Ages

We began as a people in Biblical times and the laws that guide us come from the time of the Talmud, some 1,500 years ago. But only after that, in the Middle Ages did our worship, customs and traditions begin to take the form we recognize today. What was it like to be a Jew then? Was there always anti-Semitism? How did they learn their livelihood, what languages did they speak and what was family life like? What special issues did medieval women face? Through a close reading of texts from the period we will explore just what it was like to be a Jew during this pivotal time.
