We are already preparing for the High Holy Days and are happy to announce that this year's High Holy Days will be in person for all who wish and are able to join us in the Ross Sanctuary. We understand that we're all on different journeys of coming back from COVID-19 and some may prefer to view services from home. That option will be available to you again this year. But, for those who wish to be in person at TBA for the High Holy Days, we'll be right here with you!

Tickets will be sent in mid-September only to those members who are in good standing and current with their bill or payment plan. If you have a balance due, please contact Mara Suskauer (msuskauer@tbanj.org or 973-994-2290) to discuss your bill in strict confidence so that you can receive your tickets and/or password log-in information.

This year, we will be offering a digital Yizkor book. In an effort to be environmentally friendly, we will save trees and have a scrolling Yizkor list for viewing at TBA. This list will also be published on the website. Please watch your emails for the link and instructions on how to participate in the Yizkor Book.

Below, you'll find the basic principles of our 2022 High Holy Day program. Please note that all High Holy Day plans are subject to change for reasons of community health and safety.

Regular services:

- High Holy Day services will be at TBA for all who wish to be there in person.
- We will be reviewing our vaccination and mask policy closer to the High Holy Days when we know what the best health practices will be. Please watch your emails for more information.
- All regular High Holy Day services will take place in the Ross Sanctuary.
- In addition, these services will all be streamed using a password-protected site.
- For those who would like to be with their Temple community but are uncomfortable coming inside, we expect to screen services in the Denburg Garden on the patio under the tent.

Family programming:

- Family services on First Day Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur morning will take place in the Brody Youth Lounge on the lower level of the Temple.
- In addition, family services will be streamed on a password-protected site.
- Tot services will take place following family services in the Brody Youth Lounge.
- Teen programming will follow family services. Location is to be determined.
- Childcare will not be offered this year.


All main services, family and regular, will be streamed and password protected.


You must be a member in good standing to receive tickets for in-person services and/or password and log-in information for streamed services.
